On 1 October, Dr Montserrat Arroyo Kuribreña began her new functions at the World Organisation for Animal Health as Deputy Director General for International Standards and Science. Dr Arroyo previously served the Organisation as Subregional Representative for Central America (2014–2016) before joining Headquarters in 2018 to support the management of the World Animal Health Information and Analysis Department. Throughout her career, Dr Arroyo has accumulated vast experience in global animal health affairs through her various positions within the Veterinary Services in Mexico, working in foreign animal disease prevention and control, laboratory management and import and export (2004–2013), in addition to serving as Director General for the National Veterinary Biologics Laboratory (PRONABIVE).
