The WOAH Documentation Centre provides us with many types of external information resources, including online sources, databases, journals and books, to support our activities. Let's take a closer look at what it has to offer.

Emphasis on online resources

Gone are the days when journals and physical documents circulated from office to office! In the age of working from home, it is important to be able to provide information directly online. This is why over the last two years the emphasis has been placed on the acquisition of institutional subscriptions, which allow each staff member across the Organisation to easily access our resources. To do so, and if you are working from home, you will need to connect to the VPN via FortiClient, because the user is recognised by their IP address (WOAH IP).

Journals

All agents now have access to the following online reviews: <u>Science</u>, <u>Transboundary & Emerging Diseases</u>, <u>The Lancet Infectious Diseases</u> and <u>Preventive Veterinary Medicine</u>. It is also possible to borrow hard copies of journals, such as *Nature*, *Courrier International*, as well as numerous veterinary journals directly from the Documentation Centre (Headquarters, 12-2).

Books and e-Books

Access to scientific and technical e-books is also privileged via both <u>CABeBook Animal and Veterinary</u> <u>Collection</u> and <u>Frontiers Media</u>.

And it is time to diversify our collections, which is why, for several months, the Documentation Centre has been obtaining books dedicated more to personal development, the economy, organisation at work, etc.








